



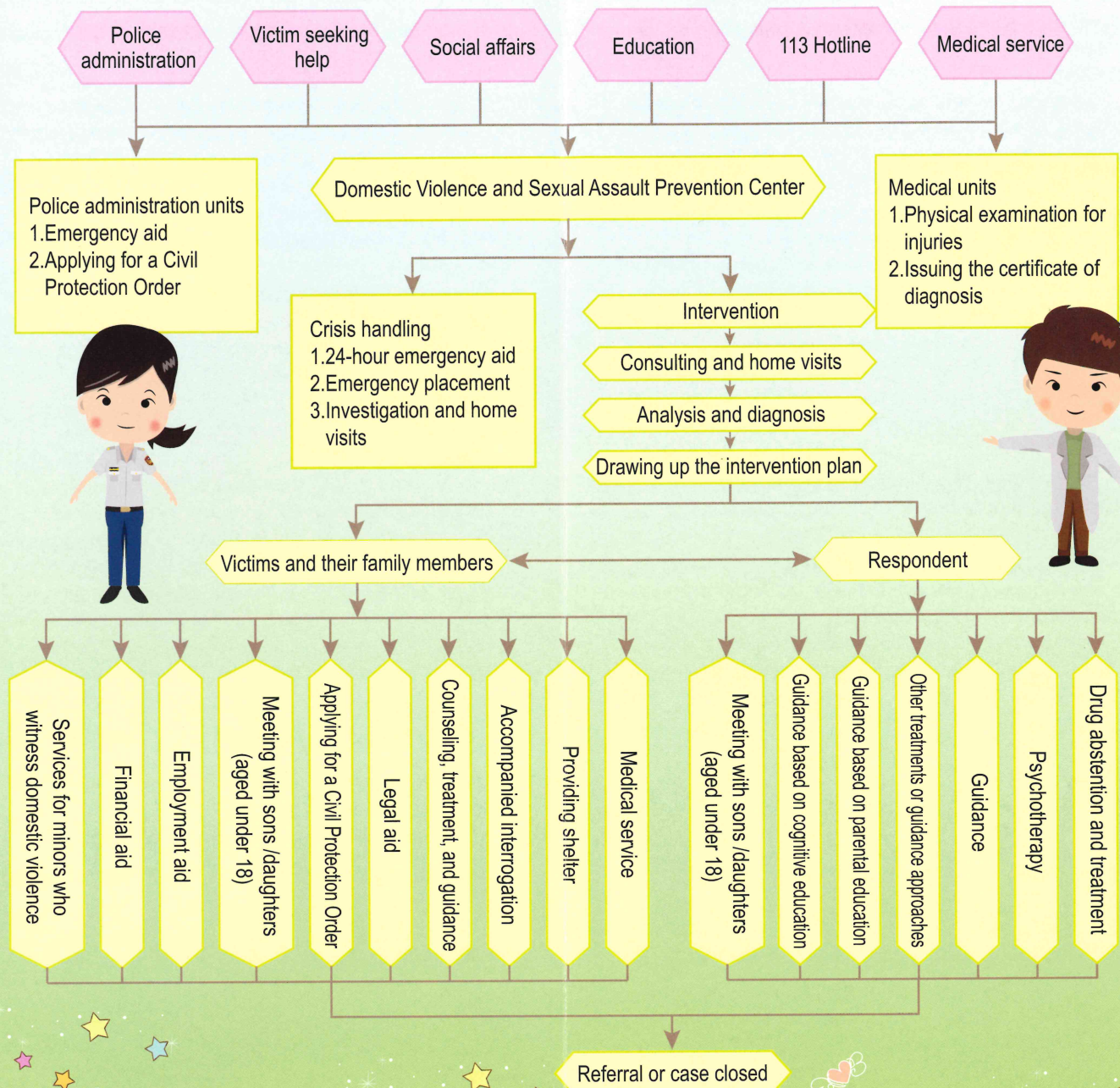
Regain love in ending violence

Domestic violence is violent behavior with gradual and repeated characteristics. Early identification of an escalation in violence can prevent deadly incidents from taking place.

Domestic violence prevention service flowchart



Domestic violence refers to the physical, mental, or economic harassment, control, coercion, or other unlawful harm caused by family members.

This service is aimed at family members and their children (aged under 18) as defined in Article 3 of the Domestic Violence Prevention Act. This includes:

1. A spouse or former spouse
2. Persons with an existing or former cohabitation relationship, a relationship between a parent and household members, or a relationship between household members
3. Persons with an existing or former relationship between lineal relatives by blood or lineal relatives by marriage
4. Persons with an existing or former relationship between collateral relatives by blood or collateral relatives by marriage within four degrees of kinship.

When a victim aged 16 or above suffers unlawful physical or mental abuse by a partner who they have not cohabited with but are deemed to have had a close social relationship with (based on their emotional or sexual behavior), stipulations in the Domestic Violence Prevention Act related to Civil Protection Orders may be used to request a protection order from the court.

Witnessed children are children and teenagers who have either seen or directly heard incidents of domestic violence taking place.

Financial assistance for victims of domestic violence is processed in accordance with the Kaohsiung City Government's Regulations Governing Subsidies for Victims of Domestic Violence.

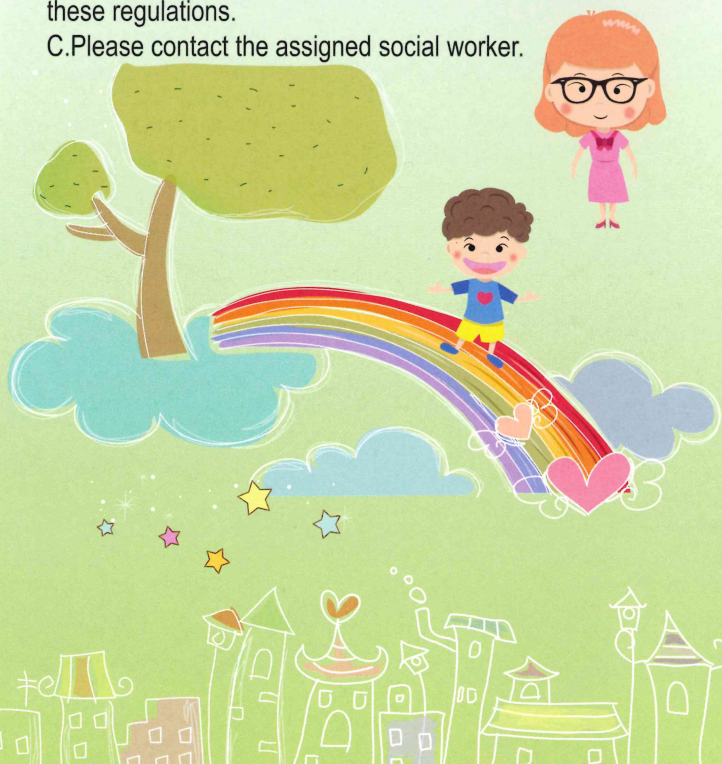
A. The assistance provides cover for:

1. Emergency living expenses
2. Medical expenses not covered by National Health Insurance, physical and mental treatments, counseling, and guidance
3. Court and lawyers' fees
4. Resettlement and rent
5. Children's living and childcare costs

B. The prerequisites for this assistance are:

Victims of domestic violence with a household registration in Kaohsiung City or non-nationals with an address registered in Kaohsiung City whose total family income and assets comply with the regulations set out in Paragraph 1, Article 4 of the Act of Assistance for Families in Hardship may apply for assistance in accordance with these regulations.

What should I do when domestic violence occurs?

You should stay calm, protect yourself, shout for help, leave and seek assistance, file a report with the police, keep any evidence, and go to hospital for a physical examination.

What evidence of domestic violence can I collect?

Clothing which was ripped by your abuser, weapons used against you, photos of your injuries, injury reports, audio recordings, and witnesses of your abuse can all be used as evidence of abuse by your abuser.

How can I apply for a Civil Protection Order?

The following can help you to draw up a Civil Protection Order and submit it to the court:

- The Domestic Violence Service Center at the Kaohsiung City Juvenile and Family Court (Address: 1F, No. 89, Changshun Street, Nanzih District, Kaohsiung City. Tel: 07- 357-3511 ext. 295, 296)
- The family protection officer found at each branch of the Kaohsiung City Police Department
- The Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Prevention Center, Kaohsiung City
- Any social services center provided by the Social Affairs Bureau of Kaohsiung City Government
- The websites of the Kaohsiung District Court or Judicial Yuan contain Civil Protection Order request forms which can be downloaded and completed.

Reminders for your own personal safety

A. When you still live with your abuser

1. Let a trusted family member, relative, or friend know about your situation.
2. Tell your older children to protect themselves and seek help from others when a serious incident takes place. Do not allow them to confront your abuser.
3. Teach your children how to call the police, and check that they know their correct home address and phone number. ☆

4. Place some money along with important documents and items in a safe place in your home (friends and relatives can also be entrusted to look after these) so that they can easily be taken with you in an emergency.

B. When you have decided to leave your abuser

1. Remember to take your ID card, National Health Insurance card, bank card, credit card, bank account passbook, stamp, money, cellphone, and any injury reports with you.
2. Make a note of your nearest police station and hospital.
3. You are entitled to go to a court, police station, or the Domestic Violence and Sexual Assault Prevention Center for help with applying for a Civil Protection Order.

C. When you have left your abuser or a Civil Protection Order has not been issued yet

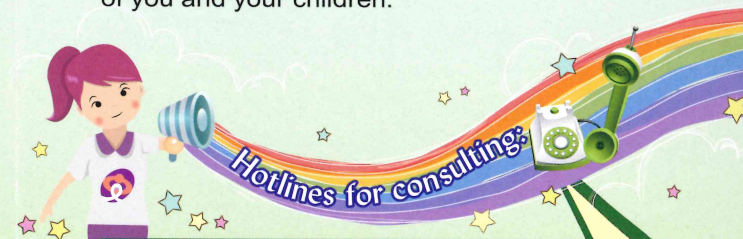
1. Watch out for your personal safety and do not go alone when you need to speak to your abuser.
2. You have the right not to answer harassing phone calls. You may ask another person to answer on your behalf.
3. You are free to change your phone number at any time. You may also ask your friends and relatives to call the police on your behalf when they discover that your abuser is harassing or harming you again.
4. You can change the route you take on your way home from work.
5. You should be aware of who to contact when you are feeling down or are thinking of harming yourself.

D. When a Civil Protection Order is issued

1. After a Civil Protection Order is issued, you

should carry a copy with you at all times, or give a copy to your apartment's security staff, workplace security guard, children's school teachers, as well as your friends and relatives.

2. When your abuser violates the terms of the Civil Protection Order (e.g., by being violent, making harassing calls, or approaching your home), you should immediately dial 110 to call the police.
3. Give your friends and relatives a close-up photo of your abuser and ask them to remain vigilant.
4. When a court has ruled that your abuser may not see your household registration document or the school registration documents of your children, you should make sure that this is noted by the household registration office and school(s) as soon as possible. This will prevent your abuser from finding this information and the whereabouts of you and your children.
